



CASE STUDY Thompson Farm and Equestrian Centre

Working with the main contractor JAY Properties, API Stone Ltd supplied the full stone package for this development in Standish, Wigan.

The remit from the owners of the development was to use a stone that complemented the red brick that had been chosen on the main house.

API Walling was chosen over competitors from Yorkshire and Derbyshire and looks spectacular now finished.

The project also had an element of ashlar which integrated extremely well with the various areas of walling and red brick.
